Del & Rod's Real Ale Rambles

Sunday 8th saw us start our walk from Ossley Wudduss. We made our meandering way through Horsley, Lower Kilburn and Holbrook to Bargate where we called in the White Hart to find Bass, Abbot, GK H&H Bitter, Exmoor Gold and Navigation Traditional with us both plumping for the latter, which was in good order. This pub has been tastefully refurbished and is well worth a visit. From there we took the footpath that runs parallel with the road to Openwoodgate, where we called in the Seven Stars though we thought the footpath we took down to it was leading through someone's kitchen. Here we were treated to Navigation Traditional, Springhead Ginger Pig and Otley Oxymoron, with the latter 2 being sampled, the Otley being well

recommended by the landlord. The **Black Bulls Head** was our final port of call with a perfectly placed beer board proclaiming Oakham JHB & Bishops Farewell, Leadmill Rampage, Marlpool Blind Boris, Abbot, Hartington IPA and Marble Dobber. I was tempted by the Dobber, but we both went for the Blind Boris and very nice it was too. We made our way back via Denby Village and as we crossed Bottle Brook, the direction of the grass indicated that there had been considerably more water in it recently. It was, all in all, quite soggy underfoot

Made a visit to the little known Holderness area of East Yorkshire on Sat 23rd & Sun 24th June. Targeted the village of Patrington calling first at the Station, which is in GBG. More like a restaurant than a pub, the beer was ok with Cotleigh Tawny Owl, Dent Aviator and Black Sheep. A poor pub atmosphere but the food looked good, no prizes for guessing the 2 ales partaken. Moving swiftly on to the Hildyard Arms for a decent bar meal but the Taylors Landlord was poor and I did not risk Tetley, a nice friendly pub nevertheless. The other GBG pub here is the Holderness, an average boozer with Wye Valley HPA, York Guzzler, St Austell Tribute, Tetley and GK IPA Gold. The Guzzler was the best drink so far but it was time to return to our accommodation at the Plough at Hollym, wisely chosen from GBG. Starting with Box Steam Chuffin Ale which I did not rate, then 2 beers from Marston Moor; Mongrels Firkin Mutt (try saying that when you've had a few) & Skylark which was to be the best drink of the trip. With Rudgate Ruby Mild and Tetley's also on this was easily the best drinkers' pub in the area. With a friendly welcome, good value B&B, a decent breakfast and only about a mile from the coast at Withernsea a return visit is highly likely. The next day after an epic walk to Spurn Point, decided to eat at the only pub nearby, the Crown & Anchor at Kilnsea. The meal was good but déjà vu the TT Landlord was even worse than England's football, rubbish to such an extent that my 2nd drink was Tetley's. When the barmaid remarked that Landlord is a nice drink I politely refrained from replying 'Yes, but not here'. Having said that the window view over the Humber was quite magnificent, so much so that on leaving we stood admiring the view for at least half an hour which made us late home but at least missed most of the football - Chris P Duck

On June 29th I called into the Beer Festival at the Amber Brewery where there was a large selection of Amber beers, which were all in excellent condition. I bumped into a few of the RuRAD crowd which included Mr. and Mrs. Angry, Bald Eagle, Pac-a-Mac and Edmund, sorry if I forgot anyone. I sampled Village Pale at 4.2%, Revolution at 4.5%, and finished with the excellent Belgian Imperial IPA (2). All in all a very good festival, glad I called in - Charisma

 \mathbf{J} uly $\mathbf{3}^{\mathsf{rd}}$ was the opening night of the Queens Head festival at Little Eaton, I happened to call in as it is down the road from home, and found a good selection of beers from breweries such as Hop Studio, Topsham, Andrews Ales, Heart of Wales, Outstanding, Wellington, Brightside, Rossendale, Revolution and others. These were complimented by beers on the main bar from Shugborough, Lincoln Green and Derby Brewing Company. I tried most of the beers, sadly the only one to my taste was Brightside Maverick 4.8%. During the evening I was joined by Bald Eagle, Sooty, and later Julian Hough and partner Jill who commented on my likeness to a CAMRA member from down south called Attila. Looks like I might have a new nickname! (You'll always be Charisma to us - Ed) - Attila

On Thursday July 19th Del Boy and I met up with Uncle Albert and Old Mother Redcap at the Dolphin Beer Festival in Derby. There were 30+ beers outside plus the usual on the bar. Having forgotten my pen I kept my selections from the same page with Box Steam Chuffin' Ale and Cheddar Ales Pot-holer going down very well. We

were also joined by a suitably lubricated Blue Streak who was on an all-dayer and extolling the virtues of the Furnace. Coach House Ostler's Summer Pale Ale and Great Western Maiden Voyage were sampled before we left Blue Streak with his Peerless Full Whack to visit the Old Silk Mill. Here I tried Llangorse Made in Llangorse from the JLB and Mauldons Blackberry Porter (lovely) and Outstanding Stout (likewise) from the bar. Bumped in to Bald Eagle who recommended a visit to Raw Brewery's White Swan at Chesterfield - Fd

 W hilst on my annual 2-week sabbatical I decided to utilise my time by visiting some beer festivals, which (as I am sure you can imagine) took me several nanoseconds to think of. On Thursday 26th I got the train to Birmingham New St where - after the usual wandering around aimlessly for 15 minutes before I got my bearings - I found my way to the Canalside where I had a choice from Ma Pardoe's Old Swan, Sadlers JPA, Holdens Black Country Bitter, Skinners Betty Stoggs and Adnams Lighthouse, on such a warm sunny day the JPA was just the trick. A short way down the canal, though shorter down Gas St is the GBG Brasshouse, which surprisingly had Hobgoblin, Cocker Hoop, Ringwood Bitter, Backyard Summer, Prescott Track Record and Strathaven Summer Glow. The Backyard brew was chosen and again prefect for the day. A short walk away is the GBG Shakespeare, an impressively ornate pub with Strathaven Summer Glow, Hopdaemon Green Daemon, St Austell Nicholson's Pale Ale, Purity UBU and Red Squirrel Hoppy Horatio. The next port of call was the GBG Pub du Vin, which was very anticlimactic with just Purity Mad Goose available. I had a bit of a trek to my next pub, which would have been shorter had I not set off down the wrong road. The GBG Sacks of Potatoes (brilliant name for a pub) had Burton Bridge Bridge Bitter & Sovereign Gold, Dent Rambrau, Purity Mad Goose and Dark Star Hylder Gold, the latter being favoured. I didn't take me as long to get back to the GBG Old Joint Stock where

alongside the full (I think) Fullers Range there were Sillhill 4.3, Great White Geek and ABC Hoppy Gold. The Great White Geek was (mistakenly) chosen and disposed of soon after. Next was the reason for this visit, the beer festival at the Wellington, which thankfully backs on to the OJS. I seem to have misplaced the beer list from here, which is a damn shame as there was an excellent selection of 10 beers on a stillage as well as 16 beers on the bar. Fear not I've just been on the website. There were beers from Treboom, Hackney, Black Paw, Happy Valley, Two Roses, East London, Blackhill, Monty's Botanist and By The Horns. I tried Blackhill Brass Thill, Treboom Yorkshire Sparkle and Happy Valley Black Magic from the stillage and a couple from the bar Downton Dark Delight (which wasn't) and Dark Knight, the name of the brewer escapes me. I went in search of the Post Office Vaults, knowing it was on New St, but having walked the length of it twice I gave up and called in the Briar Rose for a swift half before a McDonalds and my train. The following day an insane resolve possessed me to visit the Unicorn beer festival at Newton Solney, well the insane resolve was to cycle there. It was however well worth the effort of the 90-minute ride with 30+ beers from Cornish brewers such as Coastal, Fry's Harbour, Kelteck, Penpont, Skinners, St Austell and Wooden Hand. I started off with St Austell Dartmoor, which never touched the side after my exertion, Coastal Pier Porter and Fry's Ruby Chough. These were followed by Harbour Porter and Kelteck 4K Mild. At this point I decided a visit to the Brickmaker's Arms was called for as I haven't been since Burton Bridge took it over. Unfortunately it didn't open til 5pm, the shop was open though. I returned to the Unicorn and finished off with Penpont St Nonna's and Wooden hand Black Pearl before heading home, which somehow didn't seem to take quite as long - Ed

Also available were Theakston Black Bull and John Smiths. On the way back visited the **Flying Childers** at **Stanton in Peak** for my 1st ever visit to this much acclaimed village pub. A very nice quaint pub but the beer range was disappointing with my choice of Navigation Classic IPA with Bombardier and GK IPA Gold not very appealing - Chris P Duck
