We have received news of the "Fisherman's Restival" at the Fisherman's Rest. Broadholme Lane Belper 11th to 13th of December where there will be a selection of local beers from the likes of Spire, Nutbrook, Derventio, Tollgate, Thornbridge, Howard Town, Peak Ales, Townes, Brampton, Ashover, Fun Fair and Amber Ales alongside several from the Marston's stable. There will be entertainment on Friday & Saturday nights with folk music on Sunday. There will also be a BBQ providing food outside as well as the extensive menu in the bar/restaurant. Declan Nixon, the current manager, took over on August 24th and immediately started turning the pub round increasing the real ales from 2 to 4 including a regularly changing guest ale. Paul & Joby, the new landlords, are into food and are sourcing local produce for the kitchen. Lunches are served Monday to Saturday 12 - 2.30 and Sunday 12,30 - 6 and evening meals are Tuesday to Saturday 6.30 - 8.30

Friday 13th of November saw Chris P Duck

and I venture to the real ale haven that is

Sheffield to visit some GBG pubs as Mr. Duck had never been, we got the 3.28 train, which got to our destination at about 4.10. Our first call was the Devonshire Cat (which we got to in a round about way) on Wellington St where we had a choice from 11 beers with offerings from Thornbridge, Wild Walker(?), Derby, Sheffield, Abbeydale, Oakwell & Acorn, I went for Summer Wine Treason and CPD went for the Idle Black Abbot and both were fine starters. Next it was a short walk to the NI Bath Hotel on Victoria St where there were beers from Acorn, Tetley, Ossett and Abbeydale alongside our choices, which were Lytham Dark and Anglo Dutch Special. It was here I realised I'd lost our Wayfarer ticket, and I'd only had 2 halves and if that wasn't bad enough it had started raining. Fortunately it wasn't far to our next stop, the University Arms on Brook Hill, which was a new pub for me. Here we had a choice from Wadworth Swordfish, Batemans Jester, Thornbridge Wild Swan (the house beer apparently) & Rakau and Fernandes Newky Black with the latter 2 being sampled. With the rain still coming down we had a 10 minute trek to our next destination, the Wellington on Henry St though here we did have a more prolonged stop as there were a few of the Little Ale Cart house beers on alongside beers from the likes of Millstone. West Berkshire and Hidden. We sampled the Goal Train Stout & Doncaster from LAC (the other was Marmion) as well as Foxfield Kiwi Sands and O'Hanlons StormStay (quite relevant really). Next it was a thankfully short brisk stroll to the (POTY contender) Kelham Island Tavern on Russell St, which was characteristically busy (no that the other pubs weren't) and here, once I'd cleaned my glasses...yet again...we had a choice from Pictish Brewers Gold & Warrior, Acorn Lubalski IPA & 2 Monkeys, Bradfield Blonde, Thwaites Nutty Black, Sheffield Porter, Glentworth Heavens Gate, Alehouse Give me Sunshine and Bottle Brook Larger than Lime. All the beers sampled were in fine form though unfortunately there was nowhere to sit down. Naturally our next port of call was the Fat Cat on Alma St where CPD rebuffed the barmaid's offer to inform us about the beers available, which didn't go down too well.....she wouldn't advise me either and I was still cleaning my glasses! I had Brass Monkey Very Monkey Mild and Ilkley Olicana Original and CPD went for Kelham Island Rohrbach's Scottish Ale and another one I forgot to write down in all the fuss.

Other Beers available were from Salamander. Milestone, Derby, Taylor and of course Kelham Island. We even got talking to a chap that hailed from Derby but moved down south....it's a small world. The next pub was really the reason for the whole trip, the Harlequin on Nursery St and their outstanding beer festival where there were 15 or so beers to choose from with offerings from the likes of Brewhouse Bolton, Bull Box, Elmtree, Fremington, Graffiti, Lions Tale, Mill Green, Rowton, Sandstone and Wissey Valley along side our choices of Fallons Green Shadow, Jolly Brewer Cwrw Du, Norfolk Cottage Norfolk Porter, North Curry Winter Warmer and Tydd Steam Hop Harvest Dark. Outstanding beer festival well worth the fare on it's own.....don't mention train tickets! Our penultimate call was the Wig & Pen on Campo Lane where there was Milestone Dark Angel & Wicked Witch and Sheffield Paradise Pale to go at. Finally we called in another new pub for me the Dove & Rainbow on Hartshead Square where we they had Strongarm, Cumberland, Easy Rider & Pale Rider and some loud music that wasn't quite to our taste so we didn't hang about too long. Oh and yes, you could bet your bottom dollar that of all the times I've been on the train with a ticket and there's not been anyone to check it...well there was a damn keen ticket checker on our train back.....Bugger! I think CPD enjoyed the trip and will probably return but with not such a train ticket losing muppet - Ed

Opening times are 7-12 Thurs, 5-12 Fri, All Day Sat, 12-6 Sun, When I visited on the opening night there were 2 regular beers on Bishops Farewell 4.6% £2.80 & Jaipur 5.9% £2.90, the 2 quests were Brewsters Hophead 3.8% £2.70 & T.S.A. Sporran Warmer 4.8% £2.80. Beers on the main bar were Blue Monkey Guerrilla 4.9% £2.80, Blue Monkey Cathedral Quarter 3.9% £2.70, Purity Pure Gold 3.8% £2.70, Loddon Ferrymans Gold 4.4% £2.76, Festival Festival Ruby 4.7% £2.80, Cairngorm Stag 4.1% £2.74, 3B's Shuttle Ales 5.2% £2.86 and Brentwood Hope & Glory 4.5% £2.80. In comparison the following night in the RuRAD Bar we had Bottle Brook Taboo 4.9%, Evan

Evans Winter Warmer 4.7%, Leatherbritches Bad Boy 4.4%, Six Bells I Scream 4.7%, Castle Rock Screech Owl 5.5%, Acorn Foresters 4.5%, Oakham Bishops Farewell 4.6% and Wylam The Haugh 4.6% all at £2.40 a pint. This months highlight was a coach trip pub-crawl from the RuRAD Bar to Chesterfield and District. thanks to Charisma, Claire and Sooty, who gave us a very well plotted route to follow, with 8 excellent watering holes to visit, our driver had the patience of a saint waiting for the stragglers who seemed to get lost. Listed are the pubs visited and some of the ales on offer. The Coach and Horses, Dronefield had Thornbridge Kipling, Halycon, Lord Marples, and Wild Swan what a choice, thanks to Sooty warning them of our arrival. On the bus to the Derby Tup showing a huge well conditioned selection, including Harvest Pale, Easy Rider, Salamanders Tattoo Lady and Penny Farthing, Fyne's Avalanche, and many more interesting beers. We met the Chesterfield Camra group with the Innspire, ED, a great crowd on tour, who gave us some useful info on our tour, like how to get to the back barn in the wonderful Chesterfield Arms our next pub; (thanks for that) it was wonderful, all on gravity in the barn, and on hand pumps in the comfortable lounge bar such as Fun Fair's Tea Cups & Harvestoun's Bitter & Twisted. Ollie (from the Dead Poets) is now the New Manager and doing a sterling job, serving in excess of 10 ales many local, all in good condition. Now off to the Rutland serving Fugelstou's lockkeepers special 4.2% Osset's Excelsior 5.2% ranging from £2.40 to £3.00 they had 8 ales on at least. Off to Spa Lane Vaults Wetherspoons for grub and Jaipur at £1.75 a pint, we got a Burger deal so the Jaipur was free, and the next pint was 50p off, with the Camra vouchers we remembered to take with us, oh joy! life is good in the beer world but only 3 ports of call left, so on shank's Pony we crunch across the Autumn leaves to the Royal Oak were we tried Thornbridge's Brother Rabbit 3.7% an easy drinking light session ale, & from Peak Ales Chatsworth 4.5% With the Spire in view, off we go to the Portland Wetherspoon's to enjoy a Burton Old Cottage Brewery's Halcyon Days 5.6% a nutty Amber & Spire's Winter Wonderland 6. 1Amber ale with a rich toasted barley taste, to name two we supped.

Disappointingly we ended at the Green King's Market Tavern with a Cold welcome, they had only 3 of the 8 hand pumps on, and hardly anyone got served as Towels where on, so we chatted till it was bus time, wishing we stayed on elsewhere, as every other pub was a gem. Many thanks again to the organisers and here's to the next Trip out - 2.P's in a Pod

to..." check out the multitude of excellent micro-breweries to be discovered there. Big Ron and myself were lucky enough to do just that on a recent trip across the pond. After a long 10-hour flight we met up with our friend John and headed over to the Magnolia pub & brewery on Haight and Masonic to sober up! The pub was named after the Grateful Dead song "Sugar magnolia, sugar magnolia, blossoms blooming, head's all empty and I don't care..". This one roomed former bakery situated in the heart of hippydom has a fine selection of ales including Cole Porter 5.1%, Stout of Circumstance 5.1%, Spudboy IPA 6%, Barking Pumpkins 7% and the excellent Sara's Ruby Mild 3.9% a GABF (Great American Beer Festival) gold medal winner. The quest beers on were Stone Self Righteous 9%, Russian River Damnation 7% and Sierra Nevada Anniversary Ale 6%. The bar tender informed us that the pub is a consortium with all employees owning a share. A true ale house of the people, by the people, for the people. Next up was Tornado bar and brewery, also on Haight St, with over 47 draught beers on offer it felt like we were at a beer festival went for North Coast Stout 5.5% whilst others decided on Languitas IPA 6.4%. This is well worth a visit if only for a glimpse of the extensive beer menu and for being witness to the bartenders curious attempt at sarcasm..."You ain't in an English pub now buddy!" The Anchor Brewing Co on Mariposa St is a must for all as Anchor Steam Beer has been brewed in San Francisco since 1896 making it one of the oldest breweries in the city. On

the brewery tour we found the guide interesting and informative and they pride themselves on using only traditional English brewing methods. After the 45-minute tour visitors are generously offered 6 free half pints samples, which were Steam Beer 4.5%, Summer Beer 5%, Humming Ale 6%, Porter 6%, Liberty Ale 6% and Big Ron's particular favourite Old Foghorn Barley Wine 8.2%. The tour is free so can be popular so book well in advance www.anchorbrewing.com. One evening after stumbling out of Vesuvio, Jack Kerouacs favourite bar, we unwittingly witnessed a wake. The San Francisco Brewing Co had been brewing since 1985 but sadly this night was to be their last. With a 5 piece jazz band giving it some and only 2 draught beers to be had, Albatross & Emperor Norton, it would have seemed like we were attending a New Orleans wake but both beers were of sound quality and combined with the amiable bar staff and unique atmosphere all gave this classic bar & brewery a dignified send off. Another bar worth a mention is Murios Trophy Room on Haight St where the friendly tactile bar tenders served us with many a decent pint of Racer 5 7%, Hemp Ale 5.4%, Agmendment IPA 5.2% Steam Beer 4.5% and the excellent Prohibition Ale 5%. God bless y'all. If you happen to stroll through Golden Gate Park, passing the majestic buffalo, heading towards the beach you should find the Beach Chalet. This pub offers 9 of it's own ales brewed on the premises, these being VFW Light 4.8%, West End Wheat 4.9%, Ocean Beach Octoberfest 5%, Golden Gate Porter 5.4%, Riptide Red 5.6%, Fleishhaker Stout 5.6%, Presidio IPA 6.8% and my favourite California Kind 5.6%. This is a perfect place to drink with good friends and watch the world go by as the sun sets over the Pacific on yet another un-RuRAD beer trip (can you get there on a Wayfarer? - Ed). So, if you are going to San Francisco... - Davo

RuRAD Supporting Local Beer Festivals

 \mathbf{I} was pleasantly surprised by the selection on offer for their beer festival at the Holly Bush at Makeney. Hornbeam, Marble & Phoenix were alongside local offerings from Blue Monkey, Ashover, Brampton, Townes, Whim & Wirksworth, which were supported by a few more well known offerings such as Jaipur. Absolution. Dark Ruby Mild, Pale Rider & Bishop's Farewell. A good cross section of ales, well done Andy. I sampled Wadworth Horizon, Townes Pynot Porter, Hornbeam

Black Coral Stout, Brampton Golden Bud and finished off with Jaipur. Really enjoyed this one - Charisma

On my travels around Derbyshire I have been pleasantly surprised by several pubs selling affordable beer. The Britannia Inn at Tupton has introduced How Much, a 3.8% session beer at £1.80 a pint whilst Ashover Brewery has produced a house beer for the Poet & Castle at Codnor called Golden Valley at £1.80 a pint (not £2.80 as mistakenly

printed in Septembers issue - Ed). The Old Oak Inn at Horsley Woodhouse sell all beers under 4% at £2 a pint. The Queens Head at Marlpool often have a beer on at £2, not necessarily low gravity either, and the Royal Oak at Ockbrook occasionally has a beer on at £2.20. The Spanish Bar, as with most pubs in Ilkeston, is another place you can get a cheap pint and the list goes on, but the Nags Head at Ripley can beat all of them as it sold Amber Stout at £1 a pint on November 15th, well done Martin - Charisma
